Event Name: COVID-19

Situation

As of noon today, Sarasota County is reporting 50 confirmed COVID-19 cases, 42 Sarasota County residents and eight non-Florida residents. There have been two deaths in Sarasota County to date. All confirmed cases in Sarasota County are receiving the appropriate medical care and are hospitalized or self-isolated. The Florida Department of Health continues to see new positive cases across the State, please visit www.flhealth.gov/covid-19 for the most current case count and county specific data.

The Florida Department of Health is currently reporting a total of 4246 confirmed COVID-19 cases in Florida.

DOH Sarasota announced yesterday that it would be pausing the COVID-19 testing site at Twin Lakes Park because they have not been able to fill the 50 appointment slots per day. DOH Sarasota believes that by pausing operations for two days community members who believe they have symptoms consistent with COVID-19 will have more time to seek medical advice, have a test ordered, and receive an appointment to visit the testing site. Additionally, pausing for a couple of days will help to conserve our most valuable resource, the people who are staffing the testing site for our community.

As a reminder, visitors to the Sarasota County COVID-19 testing site must be referred by a physician to be tested. The physician's office will contact DOH Sarasota who will then contact the individual with an appointment day and time.

The site will be re-open at 8 a.m. Tuesday and run until noon.

Yesterday, Governor Ron DeSantis held a briefing via live stream with Lieutenant Governor Jeanette Nuñez, Emergency Management Director Jared Moskowitz and State Surgeon General Dr. Scott Rivkees where he announced additional efforts to respond to COVID-19:

- Governor DeSantis announced that public safety messaging will be sent to Floridians via text message. The first message has been sent and echoed Executive Order 20-83, the public health advisory to all persons over 65 years of age and those with underlying medical conditions urging them to stay home and to take such other measures as necessary to limit their risk of exposure to COVID-19.
- Governor DeSantis announced that the Florida Division of Emergency Management has secured an order of 2,000 COVID-19 rapid tests which will process results in 45 minutes.
- Governor DeSantis announced that he spoke with Abbott Laboratories to secure new rapid COVID-19 tests which can process results in 5-15 minutes.
- Governor DeSantis announced that additional checkpoints are being set up on I-10 and I-95 to screen individuals who are arriving in Florida from COVID-19 hotspots.
- Governor DeSantis announced that the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity will be making \$100 million available through Rebuild Florida to local governments statewide for infrastructure improvements to improve local economies.


On March 27, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-87, ordering all parties engaged in rental of vacation rental properties to suspend vacation rental operations. Vacation rentals are prohibited from making new reservations or bookings and shall not accept new guests for check-in for the duration of this order.

• On March 27, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-86, directing all persons who enter the State of Florida from an area with substantial community spread, to include the State of Louisiana, inclusive of those entering the State of Florida by roadways, to isolate or quarantine for a period of 14 days from the time of entry into the State of Florida or the duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter.


DOH Sarasota is monitoring community health trends on a daily basis to help identify any possible cases of COVID-19. Additionally, the department is serving as an expert resource for health care providers and the public, and working to make sure that health care providers know what to look for and what to do if they suspect COVID-19 in a patient.

DOH continues to visit all licensed long term care facilities in Sarasota County to ensure proper COVID-19 infection control guidelines as established by the CDC are being used to prevent the spread of the virus.

The Florida Department of Health reminds everyone that the elderly and those with underlying medical problems like high blood pressure, heart problems and diabetes are more likely to develop serious illness.

Possible Impacts

COVID-19 is a new disease and there is limited information regarding risk factors for severe disease. Based on currently available information and clinical expertise, older adults and people of any age who have serious underlying medical conditions might be at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19.

More cases of COVID-19 are likely to be identified in the coming days, including more cases in the United States. It's also likely that person-to-person spread will continue to occur, including in communities in the United States. It's likely that at some point, widespread transmission of COVID-19 in the United States will occur.

Timing

Symptoms may be mild to severe and may appear 2-14 days after exposure.

Watch, Warnings, Advisories

Global Level 4 Health Advisory - Do not travel.

Global Level 4 Health Advisory

The Department of State has issued a Global Level 4 Health Advisory, advises U.S. citizens to avoid all international travel due to the global impact of COVID-19.

High Risk Countries

Depending on your travel history, you will be asked to stay home for a period of 14 days from the time you left an area with widespread or ongoing community spread (Level 3 Travel Health Notice).

Cruise Ship Travel

CDC has issued a Level 3 Travel Health Warning for cruise ship travel.

Sarasota County Actions

Drive-thru specimen collection site will be closed Sun/Mon and will resume Tues at 0800 hrs; Twin Lakes park will remain closed and security will be onsite to watch equipment and setup of drive-thru.

The Department of Health in Sarasota County, Sarasota County and Sarasota Memorial Hospital established a COVID-19 appointment only drive-thru specimen collection site at Twin Lakes Park beginning March 26 for symptomatic people who meet current CDC testing guidance.

Sarasota County with the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office and Executive Policy Group is monitoring social distancing measures being considered by Collier, Hillsborough, Lee, Orange, and Pinellas Counties.

Employee Health and Benefits announced Virtual EAP sessions to help employees cope with stress.

Park amenities (courts, playgrounds, dog parks) have closed effective Wednesday March 25.

Effective March 23, Sarasota County's Permitting Center and Utilities Customer Services at 400 S. Tamiami Trail will move temporarily to 1001 Sarasota Center Blvd., Sarasota.

Customers may conduct business by using phone, e-mail and online service options. Customers who come in-person will experience increased wait times and will be health screened.

SCAT began modified Saturday service on Monday March 23.

Visitor screenings are being performed at Admin. and BOB.

For COVID-19 text updates from Sarasota County Government, text SRQCOVID19 to 888777.

Sarasota County Government has waived water service shut-offs through April 13 for non-payment of utilities bills, as part of our ongoing response to COVID-19.

Sarasota County canceled all events at county facilities through April 12.

Sarasota County libraries are closed and began to implement a drive-thru service on March 20, 2020.

The County Administrator extended the emergency declaration through March 29, 2020. The EOC will continue to monitor this dynamic situation and support government operations and partners to ensure resources are available when needed. If you are assigned to the EOC or are called to report, you will receive a health screening from our Human Resources Wellness staff before entering the building. Please remember to complete a Daily Disaster Logs and follow submission instructions from your Disaster Log representative.

Key Points

There is currently no vaccine to prevent COVID-19. The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus. As a reminder, the Department always recommends everyday preventive actions to help impede the spread of respiratory diseases, including:

Avoiding close contact with people who are sick

Staying home when you are sick and avoiding contact with persons in poor health;

Avoiding touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands;

Covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then disposing of the tissue;

Washing your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom, before eating, after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing; - If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty;

Cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.

The CDC does not recommend that asymptomatic, healthy people wear a facemask to protect themselves from respiratory diseases, including COVID-19. Facemasks should be used by people who show symptoms of COVID-19 to help prevent the spread of the disease to others. The use of facemasks is also crucial for health workers and people who are taking care of someone in close settings (at home or in a health care facility).


Public Records Request continue to come in and departments are responsible for responding in a timely fashion.



New Cases in Sarasota




New Cases in State of Florida


New Cases in State of Florida





